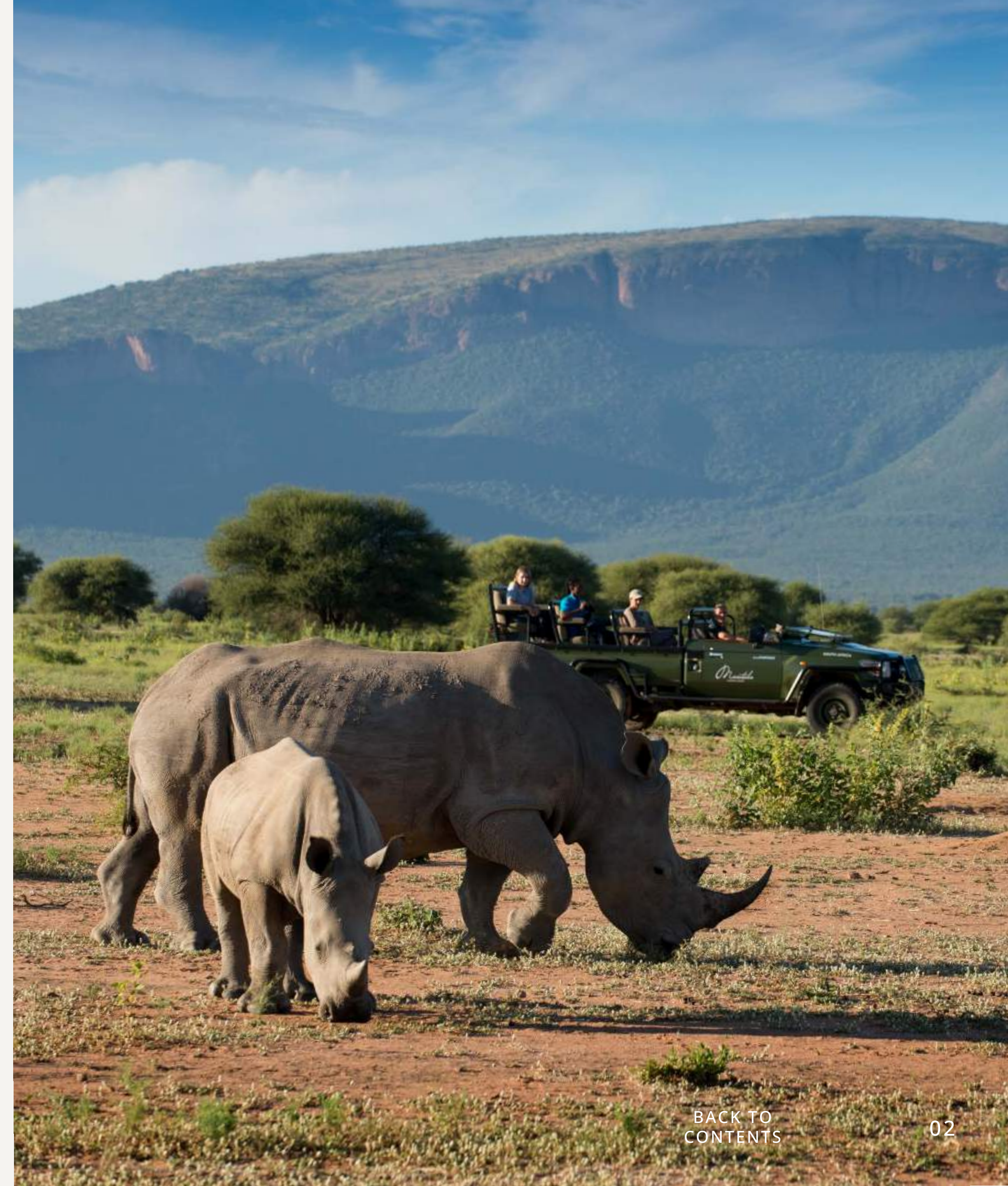

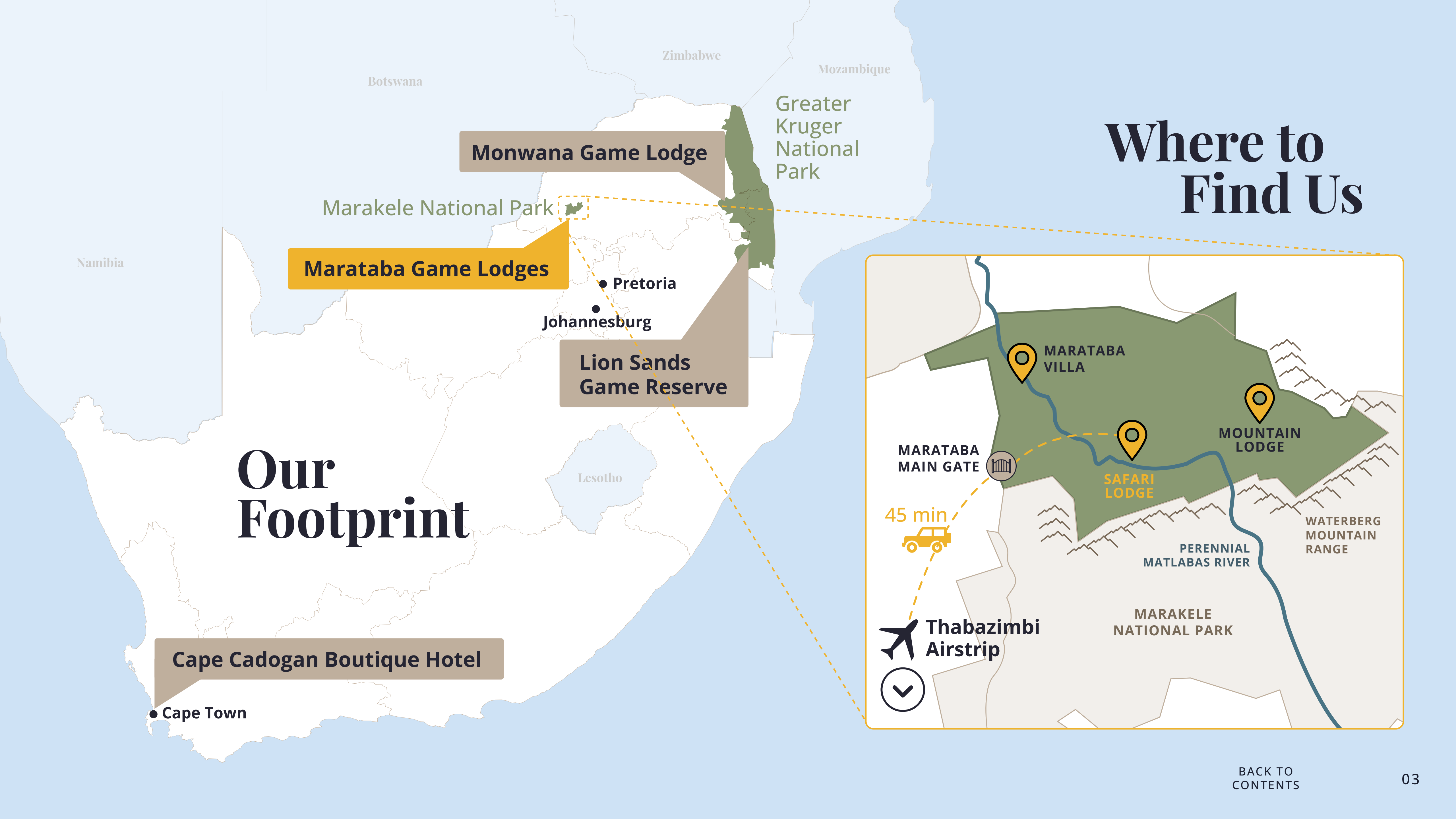

An invitation to the plains

Set on the open plains beneath the Waterberg mountains, Marataba Safari Lodge is a place where families and friends gather, and adventure unfolds within a wilderness that feels both exhilarating and reassuring. Here, stone and canvas tents open onto views that transform with the light. Every day moves effortlessly from sunrise drives to poolside play and ends with laughter and stories shared around the fire – the wild, made wonderfully accessible.

Marataba lies within the malaria-free Marakele National Park (meaning “place of sanctuary” in Setswana), its 165 560 acres (67 000 hectares) a protected swathe of mountain and savanna home to the Big Five and rare wildlife. An iconic yet uncrowded setting where adventure takes whatever form you choose.

Marataba Safari Lodge pairs canvas-and-stone comfort with the energy of safari. The main lodge is the heart of it all, with a guest pool, spacious decks, relaxed dining, and wide-open views.

Tents (both luxury and family) are spaced along the edge of the plains close to where wildlife wanders, and each day brings as much freedom or relaxation as you choose.

Here, you set the pace – early mornings tracking animals with expert field guides, lazy afternoons spent poolside with a book while children invent new worlds in the Mack & Madi Safari Club Eco-Garden, and dinners under the stars, all tied together by hospitality that feels natural and thoughtful.



Our Environmental Commitment

TREADING LIGHTLY, LIVING FULLY

Marataba Safari Lodge is designed to blend naturally with its surroundings, bringing guests closer to the land while treading lightly.

From solar energy and water-wise systems to considered sourcing and low-impact design, daily operations are shaped by the environment in which the lodge operates.

This long-term approach to conservation and responsible tourism forms part of a broader commitment across MORE Collection to protect the landscapes, people, and communities connected to our properties.



Remarkable wildlife

Marataba is a privately managed section of 56 834 acres (23 000 hectares) within the malaria-free Marakele National Park conserving 165 560 acres (67 000 hectares) of the Limpopo Waterberg's biodiversity, as well as Iron Age sites of great historical significance. The park falls within the UNESCO-recognised Waterberg Biosphere.

The game here is impressive in number and diversity due to Marataba's location in a transition zone between the dry western and the wetter eastern regions of South Africa. Rare plant species of yellowwood and cedar trees, ancient cycads, and fern trees flourish here.

Experiences and Adventures

BUSH WALKS

After breakfast, field guides lead immersive walks tailored to your interests (mammals and birds, tracks and trees, geology or insects), letting all five senses wake up to the wild. (For adults and teenagers aged 16+.)



GAME DRIVES

Sunrise and late afternoons bring a new reason to roll out in open safari vehicles, for intimate game drives with exceptional sightings. Animals, big and small, are comfortably accustomed to vehicles, creating unrivalled photographic opportunities. Pause for a hot drink or sundowner; moments in the bush are meant to be savoured. (Children of all ages welcome.)

MISS MARA WATER SAFARI

Float along the Matlabas River in a guided boat at dusk or dawn to see hippos, elephants, prolific birds, and more. Snacks and drinks included. (All ages welcome.)

WILDLIFE LECTURES

When the weather turns, field guides share the bush’s secrets in relaxed gatherings. Topics range from elephant behaviour to climate and conservation stories.

MACK AND MADI KIDS’ ADVENTURE SAFARI CLUB

Designed for young explorers, the Mack and Madi Club is a world of discovery and creativity: eco-garden play, spoor ID, cooking, pool games, kids’ picnics, movie nights, stargazing – all led by a dedicated team.



A NIGHT IN A TREEHOUSE

Spend an extraordinary night in the wild at Thabametsi Treehouse (by prior arrangement and at an additional fee). Solar-powered and secure, this two-level retreat offers sunset drinks, a gourmet picnic, and panoramic views over the Waterberg. Fall asleep counting shooting stars, with radio contact to a field guide always available. (Booked in conjunction with your room.)

SPA AND WELLNESS

Unwind with a spa treatment in your tent or on your private deck during the break between adventures. Choose from massages, facials, reflexology, and more, using TheraNaka™ botanical products. Yoga mats provided on request.



LOCAL COMMUNITY EXPERIENCES

Visit Heuningvei Primary School and the Itsoseng Daycare Centre in the Sentrum Community. This guided experience offers a meaningful connection with the people shaping young lives and directly supports the communities you visit - turning your stay into lasting impact.

RHINO CONSERVATION SAFARI

Gain insight into the ongoing conservation work supporting critically endangered black rhinos and near-threatened white rhino populations alongside specialist veterinary teams during key wildlife interventions. (Additional costs apply.)

Practical information

GETTING HERE



BY AIR

- Scheduled flights or private charters to Thabazimbi Airstrip
- Helicopter arrivals to the Marataba Safari Lodge helipad by arrangement; spectacular fly-in over the Waterberg



TRANSFERS

- Approximately 1 hour by road from Thabazimbi Airstrip to Marataba Safari Lodge



BY ROAD

- Approximately 4 hours (320km/200 miles) from Johannesburg to Marataba Safari Lodge via well-maintained roads

WHAT TO PACK

- Neutral clothing for game drives and bush walks
- Warm layers for mornings and evenings – yes, even in summer
- Comfortable hiking boots/shoes
- Swimwear
- Sun protection, including a hat, sunglasses, sunscreen
- Camera/binoculars
- Yoga mat (or ask at reception – provided for guest use)

HEALTH AND SAFETY

- Marakele National Park is malaria-free – no anti-malarial medication required
- Closest hospital: Mediclinic Thabazimbi Hospital (1 hour)

CONNECTIVITY

- Free Wi-Fi throughout the lodge
- Mobile coverage may be limited, allowing you to be truly present
- International power outlets and USB charging points

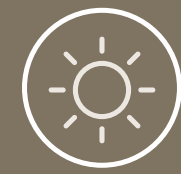
Weather and seasonal highlights

Marakele National Park is a year-round destination, with temperatures ranging from 70°F (21°C, winter min: 38°F/ 3°C) to 95°F (35°C, summer); rainfall peaks from December to February. Each season brings its own character and wildlife moments to Marataba.



SPRING (September – November)

- **Temperature:** 52–72 °F | 11–22 °C
- **Rainfall:** 5.9 in | 150 mm
- **Wildlife highlights:** Newborn wildlife begin to appear, early migrants join residents
- **Landscape:** First rains spark wildflowers and lush green landscape
- **Seasonal appeal:** Flowering plants, bird activity at its brightest



SUMMER (December – February)

- **Temperature:** 70–95 °F | 21–35 °C
- **Rainfall:** 13.7 in | 350 mm
- **Wildlife highlights:** Excellent birdwatching; young Big Five members appear frequently
- **Landscape:** Warm, dramatic thunderstorms; vibrant landscape and vivid sunsets
- **Seasonal appeal:** Lush, landscapes and abundant birdlife



AUTUMN (March – May)

- **Temperature:** 59–77 °F | 15–25 °C
- **Rainfall:** 6 in | 150 mm
- **Wildlife highlights:** Resident raptors remain active; Big Five easier to spot
- **Landscape:** Calm, golden light; excellent for photography
- **Seasonal appeal:** Clear game viewing as bush recedes; wildlife rallies around water sources



WINTER (June – August)

- **Temperature:** 39–68 °F | 4–20 °C
- **Rainfall:** 0.4 in | 10 mm
- **Wildlife highlights:** Animals concentrate at waterholes, making for easier sightings
- **Landscape:** Sparse bush makes animal sightings exceptional
- **Seasonal appeal:** Clearest skies for evening stargazing; crisp mornings, mild days, cosy fires in the evening
